



Shaftesbury Park Primary School Pupil Premium 2016-2017

What is Pupil Premium funding?

The Pupil Premium is an allocation of funding, in addition to main school funding, which schools receive according to the number of children in specific groups.

Schools receive Pupil Premium funding for:

- all children who are eligible for free school meals (FSM) or have been at any point in the last 6 years
- all children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months by someone other than their immediate family.

The government awards this funding to help raise attainment for these children. National data shows that as a group, children who have been eligible for FSM at any point in time have consistently lower educational attainment than those who have never been eligible for FSM.

A Service Premium has also been introduced for children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces. This is designed to support the emotional and social well-being of these pupils.

It is up to schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, but this funding should be used to support these children. All schools are required to publish, on their websites, what funding they have received and how the money is being used.

2. Spending during this academic year

In 2016 - 2017, Shaftesbury Park received £165,000. This is how the allocation was spent:

Strategy	Action Taken
Additional academic support	A proportion of this grant was used to fund additional teaching assistants, who provided: literacy and numeracy support.
Additional pastoral support	OneUp Foundation
Family Support	Family Support worker, Attendance and Punctuality support
Curriculum enrichment	Dance club, subsidised after-school care and trips, after-school sports clubs

3. Spending for the next academic year

In 2017 - 2018 our Pupil Premium amount will be: £165,000. Our work from 2016-2017 will continue with the above strategies.

4. The attainment and progress of Pupil Premium eligible pupils

During their time at Shaftesbury Park, we have a positive impact on the attainment and progress of pupils eligible for pupil premium funding through our emphasis on quality first teaching, and our targeted interventions.

End of KS2 results for Pupil Premium children achieving expected level

There were only 2 children identified as pupil premium out of a small class of 16 children in 2016. We therefore should take into consideration progress scores which are significantly above the borough average and demonstrate the considerable impact of our pupil premium interventions:
