### Now for a few notices...



As new academic year gets under way, we would like to take this opportunity to remind parents of a few ways in which we can all help keep the children of Shaftesbury Park Primary School safe.

## 'Children have the right to ... a clean and safe environment' (Article 24)

Please don't park, stop or wait on the **Zig Zag lines** outside of the school. The reason all schools have these lines is simple; these lines mark where many children will be crossing the road to get into the school and therefore cars pulling in and out of this area are more likely to hit a child. The roads surrounding our school already have limited visibility because of many parked cars and trees, so it's even more important that both pedestrians and drivers are aware of the dangers. Blue Badge holders are not permitted to park on these lines either.

If your child travels to or from school alone, please use the start of the new school year to remind your child about road safety.

We would also ask that parents refrain from **smoking** outside of the school gates or bringing dogs into the playground. Thank you.

Lastly, we would like to remind parents that nuts and nut products are not permitted in school. We have a number of children who have severe nut allergies which may be triggered by touching, inhaling or ingesting even the slightest trace or residue of the allergen, resulting in a severe, systemic, potentially fatal allergic reaction called anaphylaxis. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

But why are we as a school choosing to mark this day? It's all connected with the status of Shaftesbury Park as a UNICEF Rights Respecting School.

### What does it mean to be a Rights Respecting School?

Here at Shaftesbury Park we are dedicated to being a Rights Respecting School. This means we learn about and understand what rights we and all children have under the Convention on the Rights of the Child. For example, under the convention all children have the right to an education (Article 28). We also have the right to play (Article 31). We also learn and think about the responsibilities that come with our rights for example it is our responsibility to make the most of our time at school to learn as much as we can and to make sure that we enjoy ourselves during our playtimes!

### Why is this a good thing?

We think that being a Rights Respecting School is important because it teaches us good values. It is important to treat others in the way that we would like to be treated. It also gives us a different and wider understanding of the world that we live in and about how our actions affect others.

### Okay, I can see why it's important but how can I find out more?

If parents would like to know more about being a Rights Respecting School, there is lots of information around the school, from our class charters to the work in our literacy and topic books, as well as all the information in the Shaftesbury Update. You can talk to the teachers and you can even ask us children - we are experts!

In the Summer term, we look forward to holding our first Rights Respecting Week and we are currently in the process of organising an introductory event for any parents wanting to know more.
