

Sports Premium Grant – 2017/2018

The school has been in receipt of additional government funding specified as 'Sport Premium' since its introduction in September 2013. For the next two academic years each school in England will receive £16000 plus £10 per child on roll. Schools are free to spend the Sport Premium as they see fit since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for all the pupils within their responsibility. This extra funding must be spent on Physical Education and school sport.

As a school we will be held accountable for how we will use this additional funding and from April 2014 we are required to publish online information regarding how we have used the Sport Premium and the impact it has made. To meet this requirement the following information has been produced which sets out the amount of Sport Premium we will receive and how we intend to use it.

We aim to utilise this extra funding to improve all aspects of Physical Activity. These include: maximising pupil progress, increasing participation in sport and to help all our pupils to develop healthy lifestyles and positive attitudes towards Physical Education. We will ensure this funding is sustainable by providing professional development of our staff.

We have received a total of £10,592 so far this year and have chosen to spend this premium as part of the following spending:
