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### The Wandsworth Junior Citizen Project By Macy and Myia

"On Tuesday, the Turtles went on a trip to the Wandsworth Junior Citizen Project. We did lots of activities which taught us how to be safe in many different situations, for example when swimming, when on the train and even when cooking at home. We learnt about what to do if someone offered us drugs or tried to steal our phones, acting out the situations so we could see what the consequences of our choices could be. The whole day was really useful, especially when we learnt about how to escape a fire by crawling to the door and using the back of your hand to check whether it was hot or not. You never know when you might need these skills."

On Wednesday, children in KS2 had a very special visitor, Caroline Seward from the global media company Getty Images, who came to talk to the children as part of our series of Raising Aspirations assemblies. 


