With the weather being so changeable at the moment and children taking their jumpers and cardigans on and off throughout the day, it is extremely important that you ensure your child's uniform is labelled!

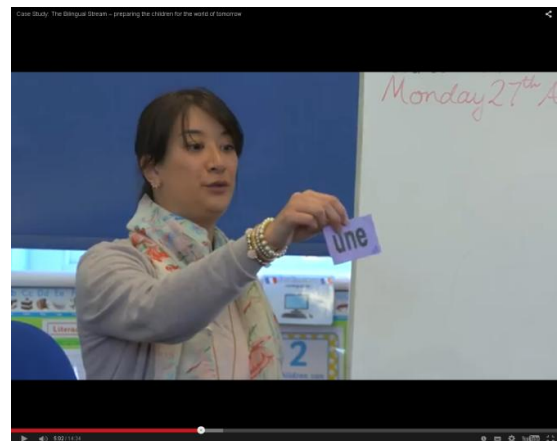
**Putting your child's name in their uniform helps us to reunite children with their lost items of clothing.**

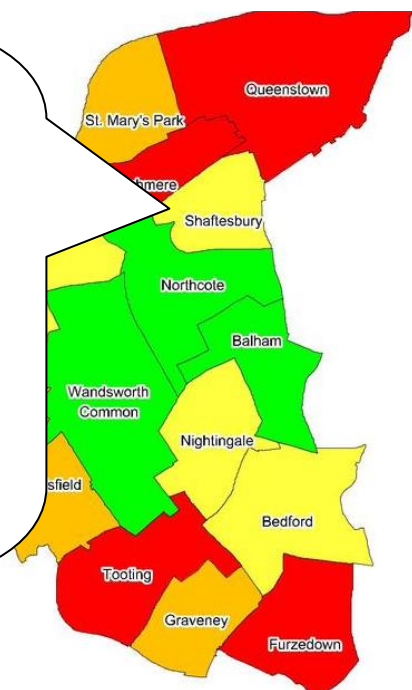

The Right of the Month for October is:

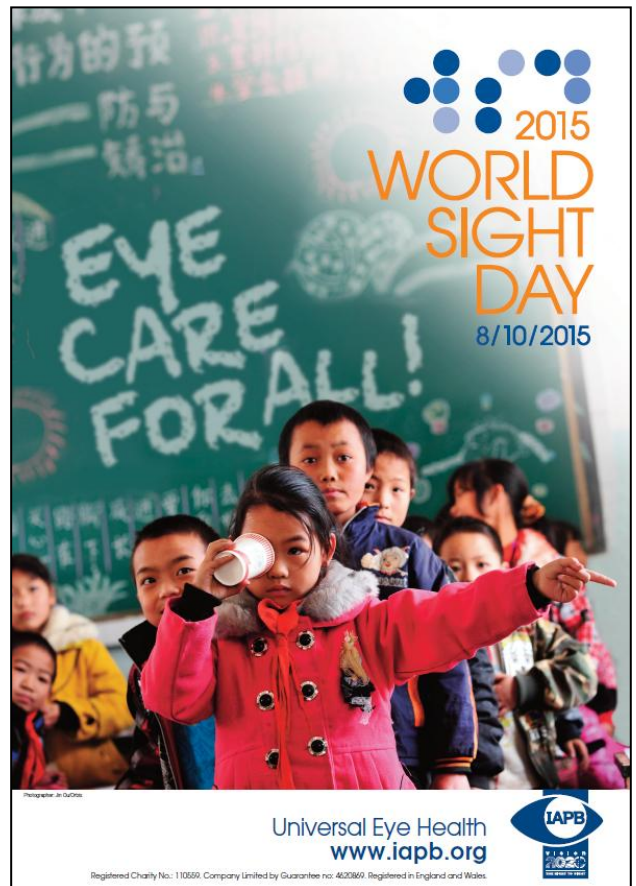
**Article 24**

Every child has the right to the best possible health with access to clean water and nutritious food.

Health is a right, guaranteed under the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child as well as the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

However, the reality is that we are still a long way from ensuring that everyone has access to appropriate health care as the latest statistics from the International Agency for the Prevention of Blindness show.

As we mark World Sight Day on 8<sup>th</sup> October, there are currently 286 million people worldwide living with low vision and blindness; 90% of these are people living in low-income countries.



**It is a sad fact that 80% of visual impairment is readily treatable and/or preventable.**
