Literacy

Every child has the right to learn (Article 28)

In Literacy this term we will be enjoying a range of different text types. We will start by looking closely at Fairy Tales and traditional stories before studying some of our favourite authors too, like Roald Dahl.

The enjoyment of reading is very important in our Literacy lessons. We will aim to read as much to the children and really share our passion for a good story. Then children will then learn, through a focus on grammar and punctuation, how to become great writers and story tellers themselves.

This term we will also expose children to a variety of writing types and styles including stories, letters, instructions and nonchronological reports too.

Able learners: We will be exploring the power of punctuation including using commas, question marks and exclamation marks.

IPC Autumn 1—People of the Past

Every child has the right to information from a range of sources (Article 17) In our first topic this term we will be looking at important people of the past and how life is different from the past:

In History children will be:

- Know about a range of events connected to myths and legends from the past
- Be able to use key words and phrases relating to the passing of time
- Be able to order events and objects into a sequence
- Be able to identify differences between their own lives and those of people who have lived in the past.

In Art children will be:

- Know about some of the mythical themes, materials and subject matter used by artists in their work
- Be able to suggest ways of improving their own work
- Be able to comment on works of art

PE

Owls will be having PE on Thursdays with Mr Patterson. This term children will participating in invasion games including hockey Rugby.

Supporting Your Child at Home



TOPIC: People of the Past and Earth: Our Home



Computing

During our computing sessions this term we will be working on the following:

- Editing and improving our work by changing, adding or removing words.
- Navigating to a website via favourites and typing in an address.

New Beginnings

Children will learn to identify that can have a positive effect on us. Children will be able to have a say on their new targets for Autumn term.

Maths Mastery
Every child has the right to learn (Article 28)

This term we will be really focusing on the following:

- Numbers with 100 1.
- 2. Add and subtract 2 digit and 3 digit numbers.
- 3. Addition and subtraction word problems.
- 4. Multiplication and division.
- 5. Measures including using a ruler.

The beginning of the unit offers an opportunity to revisit numbers within 100, in order to consolidate learning from Year 1, before moving on to more challenging objectives. All of the above will be taught in English but every piece of vocabulary and counting will also be introduced and practiced in French. Able learners: We will be using problem solving and investigative maths to explore numbers beyond 1000, involving the four operations.

IPC Autumn 2—Earth Our Home

Our second topic of the year takes a more scientific look at the world. These are just some of the things we will be learning about in our exciting topic...

In Science we will:

- Be able, with help, to conduct simple investigations
- Know the difference between living, non-living and never lived.
- Be able to describe the characteristics, similarities and differences between animals
- Be able to sort animals into groups according to their characteristics.
- To describe a basic food chain.

In Geography we will:

- Be able to use geographical terms
- Be able to describe the geographical features of the school site and other familiar places
