Over the term, Turtles Class will be learning to write in a variety of genres including stories set in a historical setting, newspaper report, play scripts and letter writing. IPC Autumn 1

The Big Picture

The Big Picture this term is "What makes a civilisation work? Could it be faith, sports, a charter or something else?"

In History we'll be finding out ...

About the Mayan Civilisation in depth and how this great empire fell and was forgotten. We will then study the rise and fall of the Edo (aka Benin) Empire and the rise of the Islamic Empire.

The skills we develop include: recognizing characteristic features of particular periods in time, about to find out about aspects of the past through a variety of sources, be able to select and record relevant information

In art we'll be ...

Focusing on watercolors, sketching and working with fabrics to re-create traditional patterns and motifs.

The skills we'll learn include: how to consider a finished product, collaboration with other artists, composition, perspective, creating 3D effects, using visual means to communicate ideas

PE

Our P.E. lessons take place now on a Tuesday afternoon with Mr Patterson and Mr Mackintosh. Each day we will be doing some simple yoga stretches to help regulate our breathing and focus on our learning.

Maths

The key areas of maths which we will be covering in the Autumn term are:

- Reasoning with large whole numbers
- Problem solving with integer addition and subtraction
- Multiplication and division

The new national curriculum requires children to be able to think more in depth about maths. This term we will be challenging ourselves to explain and justify what we know about numbers. With this depth in understanding, we will be able better able to make useful connections between different areas of the curriculum throughout the year.

We will also be using our maths knowledge and problem-solving skills and apply it to our IPC topic to create a Mayan board game.

IPC Autumn 2

What Makes Civilisations Rise and Fall?

In History we will:

continue to develop our historical understanding of past civilizations and start to draw relevance to today's societies and challenges. Further skills they will develop include being able to identify reasons for and results of historical events, situations and changes in periods of time, be able to describe how the history of one country affects that of another, be able to place periods in history into a chronological framework.

In International we will:

be able to explain ways in which people or civilizations work together for mutual benefit and compare our daily lives with that of modern day Mayans.

In Art we will:

Be designing and creating traditional Islamic wall tiles and using traditional Benin sculptures to learn clay-sculpting techniques. Our class will also take weekly dance lessons to explore and develop this form of artists expression.

PSHE

Our Social and Emotional Aspects of Learning (SEAL) topics this term are Working Together and developing a Growth Mindset. I will be encouraging the class to reflect and discuss how they work with different people and to think carefully about how they manage challenges in their learning. We will also have regular circle time sessions to talk about anything which is worrying us or issues within the class. Our SEAL themes for this term will be: New Beginnings (Autumn 1) and then Getting on and Falling Out. (Autumn 2).

FRENCH
