## Day for Change - 24<sup>th</sup> May 2017

At the end of the Spring 2 half-term, the Shaftesbury Park School Council met with their counterparts from John Burns Primary School to begin making plans for the 2017 Day for Change. Taking place this year on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> May, Day for Change is a UNICEF campaign that gives pupils the opportunity to take control and change something about their school for a day.

But why are we as a school choosing to hand over control to pupils for a day? It's all connected with the status of Shaftesbury Park as a UNICEF Rights Respecting School. Over now to Kornelia and Emily for more information:

### What does it mean to be a Rights Respecting School?

Here at Shaftesbury Park we are dedicated to being a Rights Respecting School. This means we learn about and understand what rights we and all children have under the Convention on the Rights of the Child. For example, under the convention all children have the right to an education (Article 28). We also have the right to play (Article 31). We also learn and think about the responsibilities that come with our rights for example it is our responsibility to make the most of our time at school to learn as much as we can and to make sure that we enjoy ourselves during our playtimes!



### Why is this a good thing?

We think that being a Rights Respecting School is important because it teaches us good values. It is important to treat others in the way that we would like to be treated. It also gives us a different and wider understanding of the world that we live in and about how our actions affect others. For example our class has been taking part in City Pitch this week (more about this later on). My group (Kornelia) focused on reducing the amount of litter in our local area by creating bins that rewarded people for using them. We weren't thinking only about the fact that it looks horrible, we were thinking of the effect the rubbish has on other people and even animals. Even in our work on the

Mayans we have been thinking in a Rights Respecting way, looking at how children lived in that civilisation compared with ours!

**Okay, I can see why it's important but how can I find out more?**

If parents would like to know more about being a Rights Respecting School, there is lots of information in our literacy and topic books, as well as in the Shaftesbury Update. You can talk to the teachers and you can even ask us children - we are experts!

**"So what plans have the School Council come up with the Day for Change then?"** I hear you ask.

**Well, you will just have to wait and see!**

### Year 5 and 6 City Pitch Workshop

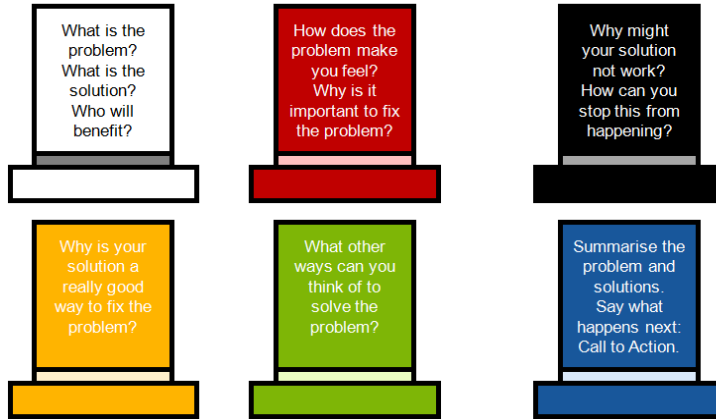


City Pitch is an exciting project that provides the opportunity for children to act upon the aspirations they have to make a difference.

Yesterday children in Year 5 and 6 worked with City Pitch facilitators and their teachers to come up with ideas for social action projects. With its dual focus on trying to solve social problems and helping the children to develop leadership, project management and communication skills, this project has proven to be an ideal way to combine the children's knowledge of what it means to be a Rights Respecting school and the work they have been undertaking over the course of the last year as part of the Enabling Enterprise programme.

We were very impressed with the wide range of ideas the children came up with from bins that dispense rewards to encourage people to use them thereby reducing littering to 'Best fest', a festival welcoming refugees to the community whilst providing them with important information on housing and school etc. It was also wonderful to see the children embracing the '6 thinking hats' approach to structure their ideas.
