

## Anti-Bullying Week - 'All different, All Equal'

### Article 19

Every child has the right to be protected from all forms of violence, abuse and neglect.

We had a very successful anti-bullying week. Through assemblies and work in class, all classes have developed an awareness that although we are all different, we are also all the same and have the same rights regardless of who we are, where we live, what our parents do, what language we speak, what our religion is, what gender we are, what our culture is, whether we have a disability, whether we are rich or poor - 'no child should be treated unfairly on any basis' (Article 2, Convention on the Rights of the Child). The children in each class looked in depth at what bullying is and at what to do if they or someone they know is being bullied. Each class shared what they learnt during the week with the other classes at an assembly this morning. Well done everybody!
