The UNCRC Articles and Sustainable Development Goals for November and December are all concerned with health and education:

Article 24	guarantees the right to the best possible health and those aspects critical for remaining well e.g. nutritious food, clean water, healthcare etc.
Article 28	guarantees the right to a free, good quality education
Article 29	guarantees the quality of education, ensuring it helps children to use and develop their talents and abilities, as well as helping children learn how to live peacefully, protect the environment and respect other people.





This half-term, we have been discussing Articles 24, 28 and 29 of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, as well as Sustainable Development Goals 3 and 4, all concerning the rights of all people (not just children) to the best possible health and to access a free, good quality education.

Why, however, do these things matter to schools like Shaftesbury Park?

First of all, Shaftesbury Park is a Rights Respecting School. This means we encourage the children not only to think about the world around them in order to become truly 'global citizens' but to develop the skills and competences that will enable them to change their world and make it better. This is in fact the Vision of Shaftesbury Park.

However, our choice to focus on these things goes beyond this and is testament to our recognition of the crucial role that all schools (not just Shaftesbury Park) have to play in shaping the future of our planet too, through the children and young people entrusted to us.

With more than half of the population of our planet currently under the age of 30, schools are ideally placed to open children's eyes to the injustices and inequalities of the world in a way that empowers these billions of young people to become leaders and pioneer a movement for a better and more sustainable future for all, a future where governments, businesses, civil society and the general public work together in addressing topics as wideranging as poverty, gender equality, education, water and sanitation, justice and climate change.

This is why these things matter.
